Meeting Called to Order -Courtney Tardy

74% participation – about same as last year. I will lobby another class or two to finish up 100% participation. We process on Saturday and give to Alyson Rooney on Sunday to process.

Camp Out – John Thornton

Restroom facilities = we'll have more this year. Don't want school open, so we will have portable ones

International Festival – Emanuela Corradino, Anna Kaplan

International Festival is also in line with most difficult events of the year! We have less countries this year – we had quite a few one-parent countries – so when they leave, the country leaves. We have to keep the parent community with this culture of participation.

We have 28 countries, we are designing the map, trying to stay in budget but some bring in receipts after the fact.

The concert is full and there are dances and performances. We don't need any more!

Doing a generalized call for volunteers makes us nervous as we don't know until last minute if we have enough help.

This year, parent conferences are not on the same day so our volunteers will be dedicated to their work.

Class presentations - Many new teachers, many also who just think they don't need to do anything. It does usually come together at the last moment. Each class has at least

one presentation. Maureen, Yukiko, another person will go into classes where there are no presentations.

Book Fair – Denise Metry

Its Nov 19-21 Tues – Thurs, with family night on Thurs. We need volunteers to cashier, help kids during the day.

For family night, we have Sylvia's Enchilada Kitchen, The Coney Island Cruiser. Maybe have something in cafeteria. Maybe a special storytime by Mrs Graves. I have not actually asked her yet.

Community Night – Esther Pastore

This is the easiest, funnest, most joyful job. Film will be Monsters University. I do all the cooking and all the set up but I can not serve.

350 servings of pasta. 75 pizzas.

3 nonstop hours of popcorn. Gallons and gallons of lemonade.

Show up at 5, I provide the gloves. Maybe hairnets. There will be nachos and guacamole. Let me know if you can help me.

The date is Nov 9 a Saturday. Pizza for purchase, soda, candy, glow bracelets. We will raise a little money.

Community Partnerships - Ali Pilcher

This is a new role, I'm taking it up along with Kristine Jarosz – It's called community partnerships - whether it is business or otherwise.

Three types – corporate sponsorships (money or in-kind)

Non financial partnerships – eg fotofest (educational)

Community itself - alumni and neighborhood. Raise our profile within the community.

With that in mind, try to raise profile in non-Roberts families – our experimental idea is growing our community garden tours. We'll have Urban Harvest, a landscape architect and a grower who will do a tour of the garden with the garden committee. Discussion on native plants, selection for your garden. UH will talk about backyard gardens. We'll send out flyers to the community. We could get 3 people or 5K, we want to develop relationships with these people.

We will do this with a postcard targeted mailing to the community, perhaps at the same time as a call to alumni.

A- Yes. We are also doing this in concert with community night. And, also in concert with the 2 civic associations.

Kristine is trying to develop a sponsorship levels in consultation with our existing sponsors. We want them to tell us what they want.

HISD Liaison – Meredith Beebe

It's an easy job. I went to the last district 5 meeting. It was regarding food services for HISD. It was their food committee telling us what a good job they are doing on healthier options and less waste. I will scan the presentation and have it available for you. Rita Graves says — we will put in on the website.

Bettina Siegel is no longer at the school, she is an expert in the subject. Her knowledge allowed me to come armed with good questions. I asked my questions to Aramark – who seem to be holding back innovation as they are a monopoly. I wanted to know why we don't have more local producers. Did not get satisfactory answers.

Waste – If we want to change this, we need to approach city council about donating leftover food. It all needs to be thrown away. This has to be done at City Council level.

Waste containers are now in the kitchens. The workers are now weighing the food and noting what gets eaten or not.

Questions -

Question/statement - Unpackaged, unopened food, whole fruits should be able to be taken back with the kids to class. The culture is that people throw everything away. Non perishables should be fine.

Rita Graves – They can't take milk or other items that spoil with temperature change. Federally, there are guidelines about what can be taken out of the cafeteria. I'll check on it and write about it in my blog.

Q – Is there a recycle bin?

A - Yes, it is behind you. However, we don't do separation of paper goods.
